



2019 Open call for Nominations to the international Commission for Atmospheric Chemistry and Global Pollution (iCACGP)



The international Commission for Atmospheric Chemistry and Global Pollution (iCACGP) is calling for nominations for new members and officers to its Scientific Commission.

iCACGP's aim is to support atmospheric research that contributes to solving the basic societal issues of water supply, food production and human/ecosystem health. This is achieved through promoting understanding of the fundamental mechanisms that control atmospheric composition and development of improved predictive capabilities. This requires a combination of measurements, laboratory studies and modelling.

iCACGP is one of the Commissions in IAMAS (International Association of Meteorology and Atmospheric Sciences), which in turn is one of the associations within IUGG (International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics) under the non-governmental ICSU (International Council for Science) family. iCACGP was founded in 1957 as the Commission on Atmospheric Chemistry and Radioactivity. In 1971 the name was changed to the Commission on Atmospheric Chemistry, CACGP and Global Pollution, which was updated to iCACGP in 2006. iCACGP co-sponsors the international research project IGAC (International Global Atmospheric Chemistry), and the international SOLAS (Surface Ocean Lower Atmosphere Study).

The overall scientific guidance of iCACGP activities is provided by the Commission members and officers. The Commission is the central decision-making body for iCACGP and sets the scientific direction and priorities of the Commission activities (Conferences, workshops, research articles and related activities).

The Commission is composed of about 25-30 mid-career and senior scientists from a broad spectrum of disciplines. iCACGP membership also reflects a diversity of gender and nationality. Members are appointed for a 4-year term, renewable once either as a member or an officer. iCACGP relies on the self organisation and voluntary efforts of its members to deliver its objectives.

The Commission office is the executive body of the Commission and coordinates implementation of the Commission decisions. It is composed of three Commission members (President, vice-President, Secretary) and these officers must be from different countries.

The Commission meets in person and via web meeting at least once per year. Every four years 30-50% of the Commission members rotate off and this ensures both scientific regeneration and scientific continuation of the Commission activities.

iCACGP welcomes nominations to its membership and to its Office for a term beginning on January 1st 2019. Please find below the instructions on how to apply or how to nominate a candidate.

The deadline for nominations is **31 July 2018**. New members will be selected during the iCACGP annual meeting at the iCACGP/IGAC International Joint Symposium in Japan in September 2018. Applicants will be informed of the result of the consideration by 15 October 2018.

Minimum qualifications and experience required to apply:

- ✓ Extensive international and/or national experience in research topics relevant to iCACGP (e.g. atmospheric chemistry and global pollution, biosphere atmosphere interactions, air-sea interaction research, biogeochemical cycles, climate change, health);
- ✓ Established reputation in the international research arena;
- ✓ Active in the iCACGP relevant field of research; and
- ✓ Have time to commit to fulfill iCACGP member responsibilities

How to apply

- ✓ Both self-nominations and nominations by a third party are accepted. If you are nominating someone else, please ensure you have obtained his or her agreement prior to submission of his or her nomination. In both cases, support by two distinguished scientists from different countries is needed.
- ✓ Nominations should include the following information:
 - Completed application form (see next page)
 - Summary cv (max 2 pages)
 - Up to 5 relevant and recent publications (either pdfs or public links to pdfs)
- ✓ Applications/Nominations should be submitted by email with all documents, in Microsoft Word or pdf format to secretary@icacgp.email. The subject line of the email should be: 'Nomination to the 2019 iCACGP membership - XXXX' where XXXX is the family name of the candidate.
- ✓ Applications must be complete and submitted by **31st July 2018**
- ✓ Please ensure that the receipt of your application is acknowledged.
